Effective: April 20, 2024

Oak Point University in Chicago, Illinois, voluntarily resigned its accreditation with the Higher Learning Commission, effective April 20, 2024.

The institution's status as an HLC accredited institution expires on the effective date above. Credits and degrees earned from the institution through this date remain accredited.
